It is critically important that we focus a spotlight on the benefits of these programs for Ohio's families, businesses, and local communities. Through these regional dialogues, we can design an energy future for Ohio that reduces costs, creates jobs and propels our 21st century economy.

Ohio's Energy Future Tour will consist of a series of regional forums with invited speakers and presentations, public comments and questions, and visits to advanced energy sites and projects. Each forum will be unique and designed with input from community leaders to look at how to move Ohio's energy future forward on the interrelated issues of electricity costs, economic development, energy independence, public health and environmental protection.

At the end of the Tour, we will compile the comments from all of the events and develop a set of recommendations on the best course to enhance Ohio's energy future. This information will be shared with policymakers.
